#### Parade of Athletes

Athletes made there way through the stadium – delegation by delegation – to great applause. Of course the loudest cheers where for the home team of Victoria, but The Hon. Dr Napthine, Premier of Victoria enthralled the crowd by leveling the playing field. He thanked each delegation, with a speech that welcomed them for something that made them stand out:

### **Raising of the Flags**

As each delegation made their way around the stadium, a flagbearer carried the state/territory flag at the front of the team. Each flagbearer placed their flag ceremoniously in the ground near the cauldron in preparation for its lighting and the official opening of the Games.

#### **National Anthem and Oaths**

The national anthem was sung by Special Olympics Australia athlete Ty McGill who showedcased his powerful voice. His rendition of the national anthem was powerful and emotional and Ty will spend the rest of the week working with the Athlete Leadership Team of which he is a part.



**Torch Entrance and Lighting of the Cauldron** A torchbearer from each delegation, accompanied by a local law enforcement officer, brought the Flame of Hope into Lakeside Stadium to thunderous applause from the crowd before Deputy Commissioner Nolan and Special Olympics Australia athlete Mark Hutton (VIC) ascended the stairs to stand in front of the cauldron. Mark was given the honour of lighting the cauldron, and after a Cathy Freeman moment of anticipation, it roared into flame and Premier Napthine declared the Games open...and that's when the dancing began.
